(A) The Preparation; of the King (vv. 28-36)

The "**Engineered**" events of the last days of Jesus Christ on earth:

I would ask of you this morning, to give special attention to the things regarding this day (April 6th. 32 ad.)

(1,961 years ago, this year.)

John 18:37

Pilate asking him, Art thou a king ? Jesus answered, Thou sayest that I am a king. To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world.

Matt. 20:18-19

Jesus says to the guys,

(18) 'We are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and the teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death

(19) and will turn him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified. On the third day he will be raised to life!'

Verse 28 to 32

Jesus here begins to move towards Jerusalem to execute the ancient prophecy:

Luke 9:51

As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem.

Zech. 9:9

(582 years earlier)

'Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle (and-yet) riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.'

Verses 30 & 31

....." And if someone ask you, 'why are loosing the colt ?
tell em' Jesus sent you, The Lord has need of Him "

"CODE WORD"

Rom. 9:5

*"and from the patriarchs is traced the
human ancestry of Christ, who is God over all."*

Verse 32-34

Just as He said

Why ?

Jesus has an appointment with the Father!

In Dan. 9:25&26

written 537 years before Christ

Dan. 9:25

*Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the
commandment to restore and to build Jerusalem unto the Messiah the
Prince shall be 49 years, and 434 years: the street shall be built again,
and the wall, even in troublous times.*

Dan. 9:26

And after the 434 years shall Messiah be cut off, but not for himself:

*"Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the
commandment to restore and to build Jerusalem unto the coming of the
Messiah the King shall be (49 years), and (434 years): the street shall be
built again, and the wall, even in troublous times. = (483 years)*

360 days per year x 483 years = 173,880 days

**On March 14, 445 bc. King Artaxerxes Longimanus
gave the command to Nehemiah (Neh 2:5)
to restore and to build Jerusalem
From that day (March 14, 445) 173,880 days later
you arrive at this day April 6th. 32 ad.**

Dan. 9:26 And after (or at the end of the 434 year that follows the 49 years))shall the Messiah be (***cut off***, HEB = kaw-rath, the word is associated with those who have committed a capital offence (He was numbered with the transgressors).... *but not for himself*:

Historic background;

Roman presentation of their Kings would be in a and golden Chariot.
now to secure a entry like this for yourself you

- (1.) Become emperor of Rome
- (2.) A victorious general who
captured no less that five thousand men of war.
- (3.) In battle the King rode upon a Horse.
- But when coming in Peace: ***the King rode a Colt***

Conquering the souls of men with Love;

***Acts 4:4
Howbeit many of them which heard the word believed;
and the number of the men was about five thousand.***

(B) The Celebration of the King (vv. 35-40)

The fickled crowed

Verse: 37

They began to rejoice....No doubt, Jesus allows the parade.

Verse: 38

Quoting Ps: 118:25-26

Save now, (Hosanna) I beseech thee, O LORD: O LORD, I beseech thee, send now prosperity.

Matthew tells us:

*And the multitudes that **went before**, and they **that followed**, cried, saying, Hosanna to the Son of David: Blessed [is] he that cometh in the name of the Lord; Hosanna in the highest.*

honour and glory

Paul tells us:

*Now unto **the King** eternal, immortal, invisible, **the only wise God**, [be] honour and glory for ever and ever.*

Verse 39 & 40

- If trees could talk
 - If the mountians could

(I remember holding a seashell to my ear to hear the ocean)

Ps. 19:1-3

The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament showeth his handiwork.

Day unto day uttereth speech, and night unto night showeth knowledge.

There is no speech nor language, where their voice is not heard.

Isa. 55:12

*For ye shall go out with joy, and be led forth with peace: **the mountains** and **the hills** shall break forth before you into **singing**, and all the **trees** of the field shall **clap their hands**.*

*these stones would cry out.... (because of truth of whats happening. Even if your a stone or a **clod**, you can say today " blessed is he..."*

Verse 39

"Rebuke your disciples!"

Why ?

Because they are blespheming!!!!

the Pharasees understood the meaning of the celebration.

Because of thier love for **position, power, wealth, influence** and just being **clickish**

(C) The Lamentation; of the King (vv. 41-44)

Verse 41

wept (klaio {klah'-yo})

1) to **mourn**, lament

2) of those who mourn for the dead

3) **the heaving of the chest**

The crowd rejoicing.....The King weeping

because of verse 37b

That the disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice
(for all the mighty works they had seen)

Verse 43 & 44

the desolations pronounced upon Israel for the rejection of her King.
The doom of their future prophesied by Jesus, recorded through out
history (failing to recognize him when he came)

Micah 3:12

*"Therefore, Jerusalem will be plowed like a field, Jerusalem will
become a heap of rubble, the temple a hill of rubble".*

1Ki 9:7

*Then will I cut off Israel out of the land which I have given them; and
this house, which I have hallowed for my name, will I cast out of my
sight; and Israel shall be a proverb and a byword among all people:*

- will you become a **byword**, (a joke, a fool) in the end ?

Verse 44

*" They will dash you to the ground, you and the children within your
walls. They will not leave one stone on another, because you did not
recognize the time of God's coming to you."*

Zeph. 1:12

*And it shall come to pass at that time, that I will search Jerusalem
with candles, and punish the men that are settled on their lees: that
say in their heart, The LORD will not do good, neither will he do evil.*

The fulfilled in 70 ad. by Gen. Titus Aspagean

- The melting gold of the temple
- 600,000 Jews were killed and the temple destroyed

(D) The Demand; of the King (v. 42)

John 1:10-11

He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. He came unto his own, and his own received him not.

Verse: 42

II Cor 6:2

"....in the day of salvation have I comforted you: behold, **now [is]** the accepted time; behold, **now [is]** the day of salvation.)

What day ? (for them it was April 6th 32 ad. (173,880 days from the commandment from artixerchus to Nehemaih

Luke 13:34

***"O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, you who kill the prophets and stone those sent to you, how often I have longed to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but you were not willing!
are you willing this morning***

Verse 44

because you did not recognize the time of **God's** coming to you."

Verse 42 :

if you dont look at this with **all your heart**, you'll wont be able to see ***For if our gospel be hid, it is hidden to those who are lost (hell bound)***

The Rejected Stone

• according to Josephus / as well as others, building Solomans Temple.....
What do we do with it

What ever your opinion of Christ might be:

the facts remain that he rode *Publicly* into Jerusalem on a colt
and was received, only to be rejected again

What ever your opinion of Christ might be:

the facts remain that he was beaten *Publicly* before Israel
by the Roman government

What ever your opinion of Christ might be:

the facts remain that he was crucified *Publicly* before the world
as recorded in all of human history

What ever your opinion of Christ might be:

the facts remain that, *Publicly* on that Sunday morning
His tomb was found empty

What ever your opinion of Christ might be:

the facts remain that *Publicly* He lives
and is coming again *Publicly* just as He said.

John 18:20

*'I have spoken Publicly to the world,'I always taught in synagogues
or at the temple, where all the Jews come together. I said nothing in
secret.*
