**When Jesus surrendered to His Father's will;
at that moment - - a new beginning began**

Jesus said "It is finished" in full surrender

John 17:4

I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do.

John 19:30

So when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said, "It is finished!" And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit.

It's because He surrendered **to the joy of obedience**, that he gave you and I a pattern for us to discover joy, and that joy is **our surrendering to obedience**

John 10:28

**I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish;
neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand.**

to what extent can a gift be given?

“Someone might say that ‘what I have is a gift that has been given to me. It has not been given to anyone else but me’. You can say that it was ‘marked with your name on it’ and that may be true. And no doubt it was a gift given to you. You have been gifted the ownership of that gift from the gift-giver. The gift-giver has granted you the opportunity, the pleasure, the responsibility to possess a gift.

to what extent can a gift be owned?

honestly – can there be absolute possession apart from the gift-giver?

Are you not constantly mindful that when you look at that watch, when you put on that jacket or pick up that pen that it was a gift given to you by someone who paid the price.

If you were to buy a gift for yourself it is actually an act of delusion.

You cannot gift yourself a gift. A gift must be given, and that action presupposes that there is a gift-giver and a gift-receiver. If you buy yourself a gift and you wrap it and you put a big red bow on it and you put a tag on it with your name, and then place it under the Christmas tree to be unwrapped by you on Christmas morning -- for you to act surprised or to be appreciative of the gift would be an act of “craziness”

True Surrender is Yielding to Everything God has for You.

According to the deep things of God, Jesus Christ came into this world according to God’s divine agreement with himself, that the salvation of the world would come through the surrendered Will of the perfect man,
Christ Jesus.

The incarnation of Jesus Christ personified all that Adam was to be.

In His humanity He listened to the Father’s will and delighted to do it. Everything about the earthly ministry of Jesus Christ is the ultimate reality captured on the pages of the Gospels.

The fact that God formed Adam out of the elements
of the earth is evident.

Genesis 1:1
In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

But then in a moments time what was lifeless meaningless and without purpose, God breathed into Adam the breath of life. God himself animated Clay. And with that act the first life was born.

Genesis 2:7a
And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground,

Formed heb: yatsar
to devise, fashion, create, {a planned concept or design}
earthenware or pottery. yatsar eliminates the option of accidental or evolutionary beginnings

Genesis 2:7b
**And the LORD God.... and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life;
and man became a living being.**

Being heb: nephesh (*difficulty in translation but not for a lack of meaning*)
a soul, a self, a person, a mind, a consciousness, individual personality.

John 20:21-22
**So Jesus said to them again, “Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you.” 22
And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit.**

8.) The Wonder of His Inheritance

If there is one word that sums up “**Heaven**” that word would be **Inheritance**!
Heaven is what God wants you to **Inherit** for Christmas.

If you think about it – Jesus Christ came to this world,
to Bethlehem to leave behind us an Inheritance.

The Doctrines, Teachings of the Old and New Testaments are both predicated upon one underlaying act – it is the act of death.

Death is what Activates a Will.

The will or trust benefits no one until its author dies.

Hebrews 9:16-17 NLT

Now when someone leaves a will, it is necessary to prove that the person who made it is dead. 17 The will can only go into effect after the person's death. While the person who made it is still alive, the will cannot be put into effect.

The Doctrine of Inheritance is as old as the Scriptures themselves.

Our first introduction to inheritance is **found in Genesis** when God bestows upon man a **garden to enjoy**

An Unusual “Inheritance” The Magi Gifted

The Gold // The Frank Incense // The Myrrh

Traditionally spoken of as the gifts given to kings is not the point. Each of these three gifts speak of the ministry of the Messiah and each of these three gifts were currency standards of the world in those days.

You could've taken gold, frankincense or myrrh and exchange those for any currency in any country, town, or village of the known world at that time. They had universal value.

2 Corinthians 8:9

For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich.

Jack how can any of this be true? It sounds too good to be true!
Correct. This is God's Riches At Christs Expense

Ephesians 2:4-8

But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, 5 even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), 6 and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, 7 that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. 8 For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, 9 not of works, lest anyone should boast.

Colossians 3:24

knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance; for you serve the Lord Christ.

Hebrews 9:15

And for this reason, He is the Mediator of the new covenant, by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions under the first covenant, that those who are called may receive the promise of the eternal inheritance.

His Inheritance is Imperishable.

1 Corinthians 9:25

And everyone who competes for the prize is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a perishable crown, but we for an imperishable crown.

1 Peter 1:23

Having been born again, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever,

His Inheritance is Unfading.

Meaning -Our inheritance in Christ is vivid. What we have in Jesus is an enduring possession that cannot diminish.

1 Peter 1:4a

An inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away,

Revelation 21:5a

Then He who sat on the throne said, “Behold, I make all things new.”

“John Look, I will fashion all things fresh”

(Scholars debate if the physical creation will someday be vaporized and He creates a new heaven and a new earth -or – does He restore, resurrect, redeem, renew, refresh what is like He did in Noah's day.....?

His Inheritance is Reserved.

Meaning reserved. What we have in Christ is being, in the present tense - kept" in heaven for us. kept

Ephesians 1:13b
**In whom also, having believed, you were sealed
with the Holy Spirit of promise,**

1 Peter 1:4b
**An inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven
for you,**

His Inheritance is Worthy.

2 Corinthians 4:16-18
**Therefore, we do not lose heart. Even though our outward man is perishing, yet the inward
man is being renewed day by day. 17 For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is
working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory, 18 while we do not look at
the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are
seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen
are eternal.**
