INTRODUCTION

Jonah

From Jonah's house, Ninevah lay to the East, Tarshish was far to the West, over 2,000 miles opposite one from the other. Jonah was in the middle! Called by God to preach to the wicked Ninevites, the prophet knows that God's mercy is always connected to any message delivered. Jonah turns down the assignment and heads in the opposite direction towards Tarshish (or Spain today). But God has His plan...

782-753 B.C.

According to ancient historians "the act of repentance recorded in Nineveh was during the reign of King Asurdan III in 773 – 755 B.C.

It is believed that preceding Jonah's arrival, God had first prepared the Ninevites to listen by allowing the two great plagues of 759 B.C. and then in 763 B.C. a full solar eclipse which caused extreme panic and doubt toward their pagan God's.

How does Jonah's life, ministry, and mission apply to us today?

Jonah is one of the books of the Bible known as the Minor Prophets.

Not because they were second string prophets, but because they're writings are considered "smaller" in size to say the book of Isaiah.

What we learn from this book will be of great help in how we view God. This book clearly and with authority, dismantles the heretical view that the God of the Old Testament is a God of Wrath, and the God of the New Testament is a God of Love. It is a perfect book to communicate the balance of the testaments and is a model of the eternal nature of God. He is loving, kind and gentle. He is also holy, righteous and perfect. Only God loves perfectly and judges perfectly. Only he can extend forgiveness perfectly and bring wrath perfectly. This book will challenge our view of God and will demand of us a more complete understanding of His nature.

1.) The Man Jonah

The reluctant prophet or disobedient prophet, was a man who was called by God to be a preacher of righteousness.

His Hebrew name is "Yonah" means "dove"

1a.) Jonah's Historical Past

2 Kings 14:25

King Jeroboam II restored the territory of Israel from the entrance of Hamath to the Sea of the Arabah, according to the word of the LORD God of Israel, which He had spoken through His servant Jonah the son of Amittai, the prophet who was from Gath Hepher.

Gath Hepher

Was three miles north of Nazareth in Galilee. The Pharisees were wrong when they had said that "No prophet has arisen out of Galilee". Jonah had and was a symbolic type of Jesus Christ.

Some Jewish Tradition say

(we cannot prove this)

"Jonah was the son of the widow to whom Eligah had raised from the dead"

And running led him to all kinds of troubles. Yet God never left him, nor did God give up on him, neither did God replace him – God hung in there!

3.) The Miracles of Jonah

The Single most Important Reason Why we should listen to Jonah today is this; He is the Only Prophet in all of the Bible that Jesus

He is the Only Prophet in all of the Bible that Jesus personally identified Himself with.

Matthew 12:39-41

But He answered and said to them, "An evil and adulterous generation seeks after a sign, and no sign will be given to it except the sign of the prophet Jonah. ⁴⁰ "For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so will the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. ⁴¹ "The men of Nineveh will rise up in the judgment with this generation and condemn it, because they repented at the preaching of Jonah; and indeed a greater than Jonah is here.

Jonah 1:4

Now the LORD had prepared a great fish to swallow Jonah. And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

Not a Whale, but a Fish

3c.) There was a Miraculous Plant

God's Grace is Seen Here When God Creates a Plant, A Gourd for Jonah's Comfort

Jonah 4:5-6

So Jonah went out of the city and sat on the east side of the city. 4a.) He was Walking in Rebellion

Jonah 1:1-3

Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, ² "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry out against it; for their wickedness has come up before Me." ³ But Jonah arose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the LORD. He went down to Joppa, and found a ship going to Tarshish so he paid the fare and went down...

he was hardening his heart against the Nature of God

In This Book

We will see that the non-believer will have more integrity and decency than believing Jonah

4b.) He was Sinking in Depression

Jonah 1:5-6

Then the mariners were afraid; and every man cried out to his god, and threw the cargo that was in the ship into the sea, to lighten the load. But Jonah had gone down into the lowest parts of the ship, had lain down, and was fast asleep. So the shipmaster came to him, and said unto him, What do you mean by this, arise O sleeper?, call upon your God, if so be that God will think upon us, that we perish not.

How Could He be Asleep?

spiritual rebellion leads to physical depression

Jonah 4:8

And it happened, when the sun arose, that God prepared a vehement east wind; and the sun beat on Jonah's head, so that he grew faint. Then he wished death for himself, and said, "It is better for me to die than to live."

Rebellion Brings on Stress Stress often causes illness and certain depression

4c.) He was Seated in Revenge

Jonah 4:1-3

But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he became angry. 2 So he prayed to the LORD, and said, "Ah, LORD, was not this what I said when I was still in my country? Therefore I fled previously to Tarshish; for I know that You are a gracious and merciful God, slow to anger and abundant in lovingkindness, One who relents from doing harm. 3 "Therefore now, O LORD, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live!"

He wanted his enemies judged by God

The Jews and It's Prophets

Didn't see that God would save the gentiles by the preaching of the Gospel

Jonah wanted the wicked dead
Because they were not the chosen people. The Ninevites didn't have an Old
Testament and couldn't get one!
They worshiped pagan deities and did strange things...
