1 John 5:13

These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life, and that you may continue to believe in the name of the Son of God.

John Gives a Great Deal of Attention

to the fact that we are to always know what it is that we believe and why we believe it. The Apostle John knew personally what it was like to have full assurance of his salvation for it is a major theme that runs through his authorship, from the gospel of John to 1,2,3 John and the book of Revelation. John is the kind of man who is concerned about the evidence and the facts of the Christian faith.

John will use the word "Know" more than any other New Testament writer.

1097 ginosko (ghin-oce'-ko);

a prolonged form of a primary verb; to "know" (absolutely) in a great variety of applications and with many implications (as follow, with others not thus clearly expressed):

KJV-- allow, be aware (of), feel, (have) know (-ledge), perceived, be resolved, can speak, be sure, understand.

1 John 2:3

Now by this we **know** (ginosko) that we know Him, if we keep His commandments.

1492 eido (i'-do);

a primary verb; used only in certain past tenses, the others being borrowed from the equivalent 3700 and 3708; properly, to see (literally or figuratively); by implication (in the perf. only) to know:

KJV-- be aware, behold, X can (+not tell), consider, (have) know (-ledge), look (on), perceive, see, be sure, tell, understand, wish, wot. Compare 3700.

b.) Confidence because He oversees the growth

V. 9-10

Philippians 1:6

6 being confident of this very thing, that **He who has begun** a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ;

c.) Confidence because He completes the mission

V. 13

Like Jesus' Linen Head Cloth

When the work was completed, the carpenter would, for the final time, wipe the sweat from his face, neck and brow and fold the cloth neatly.

John 20:4-7

- 4 So they both ran together, and the other disciple outran Peter and came to the tomb first.
- 5 And he, stooping down and looking in, saw the linen cloths lying there; yet he did not go in.
- Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb; and he saw the linen cloths lying there,
 - 7 and the handkerchief that had been around His head, not lying with the linen cloths, but folded together in a place by itself.

Hebrews 7:25-27

- Therefore He is also able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them.
- For such a High Priest was fitting for us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and has become higher than the heavens;
- who does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for His own sins and then for the people's, for this He did once for all when He offered up Himself.
