Is remember when we look at that degree or that photograph that has locked in its frame the memory of sacrifice and discipline.

There is A Point of Contact in Memorial;  
“Little did we know that right here on the sand in Newport Beach at Orange Street that I would meet your mom and Mimi to be.”

And There is The Moment in Memorial  
We’ve all seen makeshift memorials along the roadside, As friends and family seek to ‘love their loved one who is gone now, but recorded in memory’ we look back to remember that “it was that morning, that day - - that quick “see ya later” moment, not knowing that it would be the last time I would ever see them again.”

**This is all part of “THE RETURNING”**

### THE RETURNING TO MORIAH

returning means - we return to the promised remedy.

The Year is at or around 3,000 b.c.

Abraham is over 100 years old, which puts Isaac somewhere  
between 25 to 35 years old.

#### Genesis 22:1-14

Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham, and said to him, "Abraham!" and he said, "Here I am." :2 Then He said, "Take now your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of MORIAH, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you." :3 So Abraham rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and Isaac his son; and he (Isaac) split the wood for the burnt offering, and arose and went to the place of which God had told him. 4 Then on the third day Abraham lifted his eyes and saw the place afar off. 5 And Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the lad and I will go yonder and worship, and we will come back to you." :6 So Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son; and he took the fire (judgment) in his hand, and a knife, and the two of them went together. 7 But Isaac spoke to Abraham his father and said, "My father!" and he said, "Here I am, my son." Then he said, "Look, the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" :8 And Abraham said, "My son, God will provide *for* Himself the lamb for a burnt offering." So the two of them went together. :9 Then they came to the place of which God had told him. And Abraham built an altar there and placed the wood in order (purposed, appointed, ordained); and he bound Isaac (fastened) his son and laid him on the altar, upon the wood. 10 And Abraham stretched out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. :11 But The Angel of the LORD (theophanies, christophanies) called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" So he said, "Here I am." :12 And He said, "Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me." :13 Then Abraham lifted his eyes and looked, and there behind him was a ram (male sheep) caught in a thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram, and offered it up for a burnt offering instead (a substitute, in the place of) of his son. :14 And Abraham called the name of the place, The-LORD-Will-Provide; (Yehovah Jireh) as it is said to this day, "In the MOUNT of the LORD it shall be provided."

### 2.) Is the remembrance of God's will.

Isaiah 52:13-15, 53:1-12 nlt

Behold, my Servant will prosper; He will be highly exalted. 14 But many were amazed when they saw Him. His face was so disfigured he seemed hardly human, and from His appearance, one would scarcely know He was a man. 15 He will startle many nations. Kings will stand speechless in His presence. For they will see what they had not been told - they will understand what they had not heard about. 53:1 Who has believed our message? To whom has the LORD revealed His powerful arm? 2 My servant grew up in the LORD's presence like a tender green shoot, like a root in dry ground. There was nothing beautiful or majestic about his appearance, nothing to attract us to him. 3 He was despised and rejected – a man of sorrows, acquainted with deepest grief. We turned our backs on him and looked the other way. He was despised, and we did not care. :4 Yet it was our weaknesses he carried; it was our sorrows that weighed him down. And we thought his troubles were a punishment from God, a punishment for his own sins! :5 But he was pierced for our rebellion, crushed for our sins. He was beaten so we could be whole. He was whipped so we could be healed. 6 All of us, like sheep, have strayed away. We have left God's paths to follow our own. Yet the LORD laid on him the sins of us all. :7 He was oppressed and treated harshly, yet he never said a word. He was led like a lamb to the slaughter. And as a sheep is silent before the shearers, he did not open his mouth. 8 Unjustly condemned, he was led away. No one cared that he died without descendants, that his life was cut short in midstream. But he was struck down for the rebellion of my people. 9 He had done no wrong and had never deceived anyone. But he was buried like a criminal; he was put in a rich man's grave. :10 But it was the LORD's good plan to crush him and cause him grief. Yet when his life is made an offering for sin, he will have many descendants. He will enjoy a long life, and the LORD's good plan will prosper in his hands. 11 When he sees all that is accomplished by his anguish, he will be satisfied. And because of his experience, my righteous servant will make it possible for many to be counted righteous, for he will bear all their sins. 12 I will give him the honors of a victorious soldier, because he exposed himself to death. He was counted among the rebels. He bore the sins of many and interceded for rebels.

John 14:1-6

“Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. 2 In My Father’s house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also. 4 And where I go you know, and the way you know.” :5 Thomas said to Him, “Lord, we do not know where You are going, and how can we know the way?” :6 Jesus said to him, “I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.

Romans 3:23

for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

Romans 6:23a

For the wages of sin is death,

Romans 6:23b

but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 10:9

But if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

## **Well for now everyone – we walk with the disciples of old...**

**Mark 15:16-39**

Then the soldiers led Him away into the hall called Praetorium, and they called together the whole garrison. 17 And they clothed Him with purple; and they twisted a crown of thorns, put it on His head, 18 and began to salute Him, “Hail, King of the Jews!” 19 Then they struck Him on the head with a reed and spat on Him; and bowing the knee, they worshiped Him. 20 And when they had mocked Him, they took the purple off Him, put His own clothes on Him, and led Him out to crucify Him.... 22 And they brought Him to the place Golgotha, which is translated, Place of a Skull. 23 Then they gave Him wine mingled with myrrh to drink, but He did not take it. 24 And when they crucified Him, they divided His garments, casting lots for them to determine what every man should take. :25 Now it was the third hour, and they crucified Him. 26 And the

inscription of His accusation was written above: THE KING OF THE JEWS.  
27 With Him they also crucified two robbers, one on His right and the other on His left. 28 So the Scripture was fulfilled which says, "And He was numbered with the transgressors." :29 And those who passed by blasphemed Him, wagging their heads and saying, "Aha! You who destroy the temple and build it in three days, 30 save Yourself, and come down from the cross!"

:31 Likewise the chief priests also, mocking among themselves with the scribes, said, "He saved others; Himself He cannot save. 32 Let the Christ, the King of Israel, descend now from the cross, that we may see and believe."

Even those who were crucified with Him reviled Him. :33 Now when the sixth hour had come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour 34 And at the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?" which is translated, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" :35 Some of those who stood by, when they heard that, said, "Look, He is calling for Elijah!" 36 Then someone ran and filled a sponge full of sour wine, put it on a reed, and offered it to Him to drink, saying, "Let Him alone; let us see if Elijah will come to take Him down." :37 And Jesus cried out with a loud voice, and breathed His last. :38 Then the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. 39 So when the centurion, who stood opposite Him, saw that He cried out like this and breathed His last, he said,  
"Truly this Man was the Son of God!"
